

UNDERCROFT 2026 SUMMER CAMP™

See contract to enroll in summer camps. Families may enroll by the week, however, for elementary camps that are longer than one week, it is preferable for campers to attend the full camp to benefit from the full experience. One week of Kids' Camp, organized by our middle school, is available at the end of the summer schedule. Daily schedules will match regular school schedules, with Before and After Care. Full day campers should bring lunch. Elementary campers should bring their own snacks. Snack will be provided for early childhood campers. Enrollment is on a first come, first served basis.

Early Childhood Summer Program

- **June 1—July 31: Beautiful Biomes!** with Shiloh Oliver, Terriann VanDeventer, Lynnah Hall, Mia Gutierrez, Kalee Brightmire, and Sean Clouser

Early childhood campers will be exploring the Earth's many magnificent biomes. From tundras to oceans and everything in between, we will look at how humans and animals adapt to live in these environments. Our day will follow a regular school day with snack, group activities, outside time, lunch and nap (for those enrolled).

Lower Elementary Summer Camps

- **June 1 – 5, and June 8 - 12: Folktale Story Lab** with Emily Murphy

Stories come to life as students explore folktales through writing, drawing, puppets, and skits. Story Lab will inspire children to retell stories, invent new ones, and share their ideas in creative ways using theme and repetition.

- **June 15 - 18: Game On!** with Kelly Goldfarb

This week is all about games, teamwork, and having fun! Students will play a variety of indoor and outdoor games that encourage cooperation, problem-solving, and friendly competition. Activities will be active, engaging, and designed for all ability levels. (No camp on June 19 in observance of Juneteenth.)

- **June 22 – 26, and June 29 - July 2: Cut, Layer, and Create!** with Emily Murphy

Together we will explore collage using paper, paint, recyclables, and more! We will learn from the famous work of artists like Henri Matisse and Eric Carle as we use collage to tell stories and express ideas. This creative work will experiment with texture, shape color, and layering.

- **July 6 – 10, and July 13—17: Soccer and STEM** with Kate Lehman

Outdoors, we will explore the fundamentals of soccer, sportsmanship, and technical ball skills, discovering the "beautiful game". Indoors, we will also weave in STEM projects using TinkerClass from *Wow in the World*, we will join the characters from the podcast for elementary-aged kids on a journey through the latest discoveries in science, technology and innovation and make us all say, "WOW!" Projects will include listening, collaboration, and challenges.

- **July 20 – 24: Kings and Queens: Checkmate!** with Stephanie Branch

This week, we will explore the game of chess! This session works for all skill levels, from absolute beginners to expert players. Master the basics of the game, or up your current game with maneuvers like the Queen's Gambit.

- **July 27 – 31: Art, Small and Tall** with Stephanie Branch

Explore perspective through acrylic and watercolor applications! Using various sizes of canvas, we will explore portraiture, landscape, and still life art. Some will be small, some will be big and tall, and some will be in between.

Upper Elementary Summer Program

- **June 1 - June 5: Say Yes! to Tulsa, Part I** with Gretchen Sterba

Back for another summer! There is so much to see and experience in Tulsa. During *Say Yes to Tulsa*, campers will explore our city and surrounding areas through field trips and plenty of time together out in the community. We will visit parks, splash pads, pools, libraries, local spots, and hidden gems. Along the way, campers will notice the people, places, and helpers that make a city work, all while cooling off, having fun, and seeing Tulsa through fresh eyes. **Additional \$40 Activity Fee due prior to first day of camp.**

- **June 8 – June 12: Camp Wild Inside** with Gretchen Sterba

Have you ever dreamed of staying overnight at school? Or playing on the playscape after dark? Now's your chance! Campers will learn fun camping basics like setting up tents, tying knots, and getting ready for a campout. Then comes the highlight: an **indoor campout at Undercroft!** We'll set up camp inside, play on the playscape at night, and spend the evening hanging out with friends. Big fun, big memories, and an unforgettable night — no camping experience required! **Additional \$50 Activity Fee due prior to first day of camp.**

- **June 15 – June 18: Camp Oddities** with Gretchen Sterba

Ever been fascinated by weird, unusual, or just plain interesting things? Campers will explore the strange, curious, and unexpected—from odd objects and strange facts to unusual places and surprising discoveries. We'll create mini collections, investigate curiosities, and share the things that make us say, "Wait... what?" This camp is all about noticing, wondering, and celebrating the weird and wonderful—no expertise required.

- **June 22 - 26: Say Yes! to Tulsa, Part II** with Gretchen Sterba

Campers will continue to explore our city and surrounding areas—same theme as part 1, but different locations and experiences! **Additional \$40 Activity Fee due prior to first day of camp.**

- **June 29 – July 2: Maps, Monsters & Mythical Creatures** with Gretchen Sterba

Love imaginary worlds, secret places, and drawing maps? Campers will create their own worlds by designing maps, inventing places, and imagining the stories and myths that live there. Campers can draw, build, name, and explore lands of their own making—adding creatures, landmarks, and legends along the way. Whether you love to sketch, tell stories, or just quietly create, this camp is a perfect place to let your imagination roam.

Middle School Summer Program

- **Latitude 37 Camp: An Oklahoma Expedition: June 1 - 6** with Ashley Dignan and Brooke Kirchner

Follow the 37th Parallel on an immersive outdoor expedition across some of Oklahoma's most fascinating landscapes. Campers will hike Gloss Mountain and Black Mesa, explore the depths of Alabaster Caverns, dig for crystals at the Salt Plains, and hunt fossils hidden in ancient landscapes. With geocaching, stargazing, and a visit to the rare three-state corner, this camp blends history, geology, and outdoor adventure into one incredible journey. Nights are spent under the stars, days are filled with discovery, and every stop tells a story written in stone, sky, and history. **Additional \$370 Trip and Activity Fee due prior to first day of camp.**

- **Middle School Entrepreneurship July 27 - 31** with Natasha Guerra

This week offers a productive blend of academics and real-world entrepreneurship. Mornings are dedicated to completing summer schoolwork, while afternoons transform into a hands-on business lab where students manage Kids Camp and Peace, Love, and Honey. Participants will take the lead on activity planning, schedule management, and financial tracking to learn the "business of summer" before wrapping up the week with a celebratory Friday trip to Paradise Beach Water Park. **Additional \$25 Activity Fee due prior to first day of camp.**

Peace, Love and Kids' Camp

- **August 3 – August 7:** Middle school campers (with adult supervision) provide organized activities each day for early childhood and elementary campers. **Early childhood camp** takes place in the Fine Arts building; each day will include indoor games and activities, early childhood works, outside breaks, and snacks. On Wednesday and Friday, early childhood campers should bring a change of clothes, sunscreen, bug spray, and swimsuit/towel for water play. **Elementary camp** takes place in a lower elementary classroom; each day will include indoor games and activities, an age-appropriate movie one afternoon, quiet time, outside recess, and snacks. On Thursday, elementary campers will attend a field trip to the Tulsa Discovery Lab. Permission slips will be emailed prior to August 1st. All campers should bring lunch each day. Before care for all campers is held in the lower elementary commons and aftercare for all campers is held in the Fine Arts building.
